BBEST will hold a development afternoon, with presentations about architecture and design, **from 4 to 6pm on Saturday 11 October** in the Fulwood Room, Broomhill Methodist Church. As part of this members are invited to attend the second BBEST Annual General Meeting The first AGM, in December 2013, saw the start of the Neighbourhood Planning process for the BBEST area, and it's been an exciting year since then.

The meeting will give members further opportunity for consultation on the plan with round table discussion of our five key themes:

Active travel corridors, Green spaces, Central retail district, Architecture and conservation, promoting sustainable and balanced communities

There will be an opportunity to see and discuss the work that University of Sheffield students in the Department of Architecture are carrying out in relation to developing a 'design guide' to accompany the Neighbourhood Plan.

There will, of course, be a formal Annual General meeting where members can discuss the work which has been done on the plan over the last ten months or so.
